#### **Catfield Parish Council meeting highlights**

#### Wednesday 4<sup>th</sup> January 2023

• **Public** – Discussed Anglian Water procedures when residents have continuous periods without water, such as during the hot dry weather in Aug 2022.

#### Cllr Grove-Jones update:

- No movement on Nutrient Neutrality
- There is a Saline Barrier at Potter Heigham to protect over wintering fish from saline surges. Anyone observing dead fish should report it to the environmental agency.
- Conditions on Sands development have been agreed and work to commence in the spring.

#### Cllr Price update:

- County Council progressing with devolution deal. There will be a public consultation and participation is encouraged.
- Potter Heigham bridge investigation works to take until the end of the month.
- PA/22/2921 Laurels Farmhouse There are now 2 separate applications, installation of roof mounted panels and ground mounted systems. PC in support of roof mounted panels but stand by their concerns of the ground mounted systems.
- PF/22/2897 14 Long Lane Two story extension to side of house No objections by PC
- PF/22/2898 Ludham Water Tower Removal and installation of antenna and associated equipment— No objections by PC
- Polluted water into the Ant, Broads and Marshes SSSI PC to request date of dye tests and reasons why the Environmental Agency is taken so long to carry out the tests. Impacts of the pollutants can already be seen.
- Mud on roads around Fenside Two written complaints received. Concerns also raised regarding damage to the verges. PC to write to Highways regarding the complaints and request any advice on prevention.
- Catfield recreation ground A cost of £1000 was agreed to address the high-risk items and for work to commence as soon as weather permits.
- Village Hall bench Bench to be delivered within 4 weeks.
- Mushroom Site verge PC to investigate restoring the verge along the Mushroom site. A
  letter will be sent to the landowner asking to move the fencing into the Highways
  boundary. A letter will be sent to North Norfolk Council if landowner does not agree.
- Flo Gas light pollution PC will monitor the lights as they potentially mimic car lights.
- **Hedging on The Street near The Crown** Hedging protruding onto the road causing pedestrians to walk into the road. PC to request owner to cut the hedge back.
- Village Hall PC representative appointed to liaise with Village Hall Management Committee and attend their meetings.
- All Saints Church Grant agreed over 4 years for ride on mower for grass cutting.

Our case this month is Milo, a 12 year old domestic short haired cat. He was brought in following gradual weight loss despite an excellent appetite. He was also more vocal than normal and his coat was dull and coarse where it was normally in excellent condition. Initially his owners had put the weight loss and poor coat condition down to his age and assuming he was just getting old.

On examination Milo was still bright and responsive, but he was very lean and had lost over half a kilogram in under a year. He had developed a heart murmur which had never previously been detected and his thyroid gland in his neck was enlarged. Milo's owner agreed to blood tests which showed a significantly raised thyroid level confirming our suspicion of hyperthyroidism. The thyroid acts like a metronome for a cats metabolism and extra thyroid hormone leads to elevated blood pressure, strain on the heart and also the liver and kidneys as well. We were also able to scan his heart which showed enlarged on the left atrium consistent with heart disease.

The treatment options for hyperthyroidism are numerous and include surgery, a special diet and even radioactive iodine treatment! However, most owners opt for oral treatment and this is what Milo was started on. Within a month of starting treatment his thyroid levels was back within normal limits. He was also given medication for his heart which has helped to prevent further progression of his heart disease. All being well Milo will continue to respond to treatment and have a good few years with his owners.

Thyroid screening is available to all our patients and for those with no clinical signs of illness we offer a senior wellness package that includes screening for diabetes, liver and kidney disease as well. It is also worth mentioning that after many months of difficulties obtaining cat vaccines we are now able to offer routine cat vaccination again.

### News and happenings – Catfield Environmental Group, February 2023

After a lot of practical activity at the end of last year, our group is having a quiet start to 2023 while we continue planning our activities. If your new year's resolution was to spend more time outdoors, come along and join us to help make a difference to your village!

We await news from North Norfolk District Council about our proposed perennial planters and bench on the grassed area at the corner of The Street and New Road. Once permission is granted, we can set about raising the necessary funds and making that project a reality.

#### Sandholes

In the meantime, we have taken the first small steps in a potential project at Sandholes, the Parish Council-owned area of land that links The Street with New Road with a public footpath. The area is thick with trees and marshy patches, and grasses bear witness to the previous existence of a pond. We would like to work on enhancing the biodiversity of the site and also make it more accessible to members of the public. To begin with, we have had a site meeting with Lucy Seely, Wildlife and Community Officer at Norfolk Wildlife Trust, who is going to enlist a conservation officer colleague to assist and also return in the spring to help us take some initial practical action.

The first thing we need to do is to do a baseline assessment of existing wildlife species in the area, so we know what is already there. This will cover not just trees, plants, mammals and birds but also fungi and insects, including butterflies and moths. If you have expertise in identifying and recording any of these, and would like to help us get this project underway, or if you would like to help in some other way, please do get in touch!

#### New trees in your garden?

If you've been thinking about planting a tree or two in your garden it's not too late to do so this winter. While tree-planting schemes run by Norfolk County Council and Woodland Trust are generally aimed at larger numbers, and applications are currently closed, single trees can still be bought at low cost from the latter and also from reputable nurseries. You may find you have room for more than you think. Why not team up with some neighbours to plant a range of species? Or plan ahead now for the autumn!

#### Litter pick

We unfortunately had to cancel our litter pick on  $28^{th}$  December due to bad weather, but aim to reschedule that in the not too distant future - watch this space! Finally, we are running a bingo evening in the village hall on Friday 3rd March – details next month.

#### **FARMING NEWS**

I've just looked back 12 months to see what was happening in 2022. Covid, Avian Flu, uncertainty in agricultural commodity markets, in 2022 we already have all that plus huge rises in energy costs and uncertainty over deliveries of fuel, fertilizers, spare parts and availability of labour. We still have uncertainty over the future of the Environment with Defra offering schemes at near or below the cost. Well not much has changed, except everything is more volatile.

Defra are struggling to get farmers to sign up to Sustainable Farming Incentive, so they are offering a signing on fee of £1000 for the first 50ha. The problem is that the payments are so low, the scheme is not worthwhile at present. Interestingly this is the same tactic the Government are using to try to get the nurses back to work and that is not going well.

If you think we have problems introducing beavers in Norfolk look at what is happening in the wilder parts of the EU in Lower Saxony and Italy. Wolves have been encouraged for the past 20 years with legislation to protect them. As a result, wolves have increased numbers by a third each year so that there are now around 160 packs across the EU. A success for environmental protection. The downside is that stock deaths related to wolf attacks has increased from 40 a year (20 years ago) to 2881 sheep and goats plus 251 cattle but more importantly Ursula Von der Leyen's miniature horse, Dolly. Ursula is President of the European Commission and a strict defender of all things European, especially their environmental regulations. What's the betting that rules on protected species are about to be changed in Europe and a bounty put on a wolf's head? I very much doubt its one wolf killing all these farm animals, so isn't the correct response to have a balanced environment? Then one gets into the debate of what is a balanced environment? Just leave it to professional farmers who know, we really don't need all this legislation, we just need a subsidy system that fits all situations and promotes sustainable food production alongside a sustainable environment.

We finally finished hedge planting with some 14,000 plants being planted in Catfield. It's transformed field margins and will have a positive effect on small birds. Its back breaking work and thanks must go to the 3 man team that's been planting, who only have 20,000 plants to go on other farms! Ponds and some ditches have been cleaned out and now water levels are back to seasonal normal levels, I've been really pleased by how clean and clear the water is, the wild life has also returned, especially the birds. I can't believe it's the water quality that's attracting them, but it may just be that the worst of bird flu is over and they feel safe coming back to my farm. If that's the case, where have they been hiding for the last 4 months and why pick this time of year to return home? Now they are here, they are getting fed with some very expensive wheat.

The Cantley Sugar Beet factory lime kiln fell to bits in mid-December and the factory closed. This has caused chaos in getting beet delivered to the next nearest factories at Bury St Edmunds and Wissington. For a business that was already struggling with its carbon footprint, this just adds more carbon to production costs. On the bright side we still seem to be getting our "Local Premium" for being close to the factory. Our planned visit to the factory was first cancelled but has been re-instated as a meeting. I'm guessing that at the meeting British Sugar will either be saying "we have the ability to re-build the factory" or "its going to cost too much to re-build the factory" just at a time when the negotiated 2023-4 price leaves a margin as long as we grow high yields.

### **Chef's Specials**



#### Meringues with Passion Fruit Coulis

#### **Ingredients** (makes 6)

10 egg whites 550g icing sugar 2tsp lemon juice

#### For the coulis

7 passion fruits Caster sugar, to taste 1tbsp orange juice

#### Method

- Preheat the oven to 100C. Place the egg whites in a mixer and whisk. After they
  froth and begin to fold in on themselves, slowly add the sugar. Whisk until stiff
  peaks form, then slowly whisk in the lemon juice.
- Scoop out a large serving spoon of the mixture for each meringue and drop onto a non-stick baking tray or silicone mat. Create peaks by gently touching the mixture with the back of the spoon and lifting it away.
- 3. Bake on the middle shelf for about 2 hours. If you like your meringues a little chewy, remove them at this point and leave to cool on a wire rack. If you prefer them crunchier, leave them a little longer.
- 4. To make the coulis cut the passion fruit in half and scrape out the seeds and pink flesh. Using a blender, blitz the fruit with the pulse button until the flesh comes away from the seeds but the seeds remain whole. Pass through a sieve, ensuring you keep all the juice. Add sugar to the juice in a ratio of approximately 2:1 juice to sugar, according to taste. Pour into a pan with the orange juice and bring to the boil whisking continuously until the quantity is reduced by half. Remove from the heat and allow to cool.
- When ready to serve, dribble a tablespoon of the coulis over the top of each meringue.

#### The Kings of Catfield

The painted panels of medieval church screens are one of the artistic glories of Norfolk. While not as familiar as some, those at Catfield church, which date to c. 1450-75, are among the finest in the quality of their painting, which has all the richness, fluidity and charm of the best art of its period. The imagery of the Catfield screen is equally remarkable. Ranged along the lower, solid part of the screen is a series of sixteen saintly kings. The costume of most consists of a mantle over a tunic, coloured red or green and accented here and there by blue or mauve. Each has a gold crown, matched in some cases a gold belt of the heavy type known as a baldric. There are youthful kings (beardless), middle aged kings (brown hair and beards) and old ones (bearded, with grey or white hair). The differences do not relate to the identity of the figures but was intended to make the ensemble more interesting to look at.

This ensemble is unique. No other parish church roodscreen is known to have more than four kings painted on it. However, the larger stone screens that stood in cathedrals and large monastery churches routinely had sculpted images of kings on them. For example, the great screen at York Minster has fourteen figures of kings. Catfield's screen was probably influenced by such displays. However, there is an important difference between its imagery and that of the great churches. In the latter, the kings were primarily historical rather than saintly. (At York Minster, they represent the kings of England from William the Conqueror to Henry VI.) By contrast, the Catfield figures are all of saints.

Who are the Catfield kings? Regrettably, we cannot identify most of them. Originally, the name of each was to have been painted on a little white scroll, but this seems never to have been done. (One of the scrolls can be seen on the south side of the screen, above the king flanking the chancel doorway.) Only a few of the kings hold emblems that make identification clear. Thus, on the north side, the middle-aged king holding a golden lily is St Kenelm, a prince of Mercia martyred in the ninth century, while the beardless king holding a ring is St Edward the Confessor (died 1066), to whom St John the apostle of Christ is supposed to have miraculously given a ring. On the south side, the king with an arrow represents St Edmund, the king of East Anglia killed by the Vikings in AD 869. Other kings probably represent St Oswine (holding a spear), Edmund Ironside (considered a saint), also holding a spear, St Ethelbert of Kent (holding a church), St Sebert, king of the East Saxons (also holding a church), and St Oswald of Northumbria, holding a cross (now very hard to see). Although unparalleled in screen painting, the Catfield kings have parallels in late medieval stained glass and texts. They testify to an unusual interest in royal sanctity which nobody has yet been able to explain.

#### ThinkWilt on the year ahead

The good ship *ThinkWilt*, readers will recall, was last seen in irons on a lee shore of despair, battered by the winds of circumstance and with no bottom for an anchor of hope and reason. A rescue tug sent by our Editor and some loyal readers resulted in a tow to a safe haven, where a refit has enabled *ThinkWilt* and her eponymous captain to venture onto the choppy waters of a new year, This piece was written on New Year's Day, so although readers will not see it until the end of January, it is not too late for ThinkWilt's forecasts for the year.

<u>Coronation</u> King Charles III will be duly crowned, in a ceremony striking a balance between ceremony and economy, and His Majesty will govern wisely, within the bounds of his constitutional powers.

<u>Politics</u> This government will still be in power at the end of the year, but with a different leader. The ruling party will not risk a general election, so its term of office will run its course until 2024.

<u>Fossil fuels</u> New licences will be issued, despite the efforts of Just Stop Oil. Protests will continue, as will legal challenges to the plans for the new coal mine in Cumbria. ThinkWilt blames not the hard-pressed health workers but years of underinvestment in infrastructure, training and retention. The NHS will survive. Somehow. Because it does.

<u>Football</u> The Lionesses will reach the semi-finals of the World Cup, and be knocked out by Germany, the Netherlands or the USA. They will be fêted on their return. Norwich City, under their newly appointed head coach, will reach the play-offs but will not achieve promotion. There will be no change of ownership.

<u>Immigration</u> Attempts to reach this country will continue. Many voters, including some readers of this article, will agree with the government's approach of increasing cruelty to people who are "other". Worldwide, the only feasible practice will continue of placing refugees in camps until the problem goes away. It won't, and climate change and economic hardship will make it worse.

So, what can we do as individuals? Sorry, not a lot. Just be kind to those around you.

Fortunately, other tidal lagoon projects are currently being proposed along the Welsh coast in Flintshire, Denbighshire & Swansea.

<u>Swansea Blue Eden Project</u> £1.7bn renewable energy project. A team of engineers from several private companies will initially build a hub for electric vehicles charging but the larger scheme is set to include a raft of facilities including a tidal lagoon, a mega data centre, a high-tech battery manufacturing plant, green hydrogen production, floating solar panels & a battery storage facility. <u>Ref.</u> R. **Finally...** "Tidal power could become a vital portion of the UK's energy mix and help provide energy security if given appropriate government priority and backing, according to experts.




